There has been no lack of words printed and spoken regarding the tragic events at Emmanuel AME Church in Charleston last month, but some of the most poignant in my mind have come from Dr. Lovett Weems who was The Rev. Clementa Pinckney's professor in his doctoral program at Wesley Theological Seminary in Washington, D.C. Dr. Weems writes,

"You see, most people view this incident through the lens of race relationships rather than Christian witness. Racial hatred, we are now told, caused the tragedy, but the reactions of the people of Mother Emanuel during and after this horrible event demonstrate to the world what it means to live according to one's beliefs, even when confronted with such unthinkable evil...It is reported that the accused shooter said afterward that for a moment he considered not carrying out his deadly intentions because the people had treated him so well. I know that is how my friend Clem welcomed him — and everyone who came into his presence. A litany used across AME churches on the Sunday after the deaths repeated the phrase — 'The doors of the church are still open.'

If hospitality set the stage, forgiveness demonstrated that their faith was the real thing. The forgiving spirit of the families of victims and church members is a reflection of the church's embodiment of a central component of Christian witness. While the world reacted with amazement and surprise at their forgiving spirits, such a response would be expected from those closest to the church, including younger people. It was the spirit they had seen in their pastor."



Pete notices that T.J. is wearing a strange sash that looks a lot like a Boy Scouts merit bag sash. He explains that he gets one badge for each of the different Master Blast's that he has tasted. Maybe at one time in your life you were a boy scout, a cub scout or a girl scout and you wore one of those sashes. Each time you showed a proficiency in a particular area you were given a merit badge to sew onto your sash. This ad reminded me of how many Christians struggle with the concepts of grace and works.

We all long to believe that God accepts us as we are, warts, bumps, bruises and flaws. God's acceptance of us as we are is *grace*. Deep down in our heart's we still struggle to believe the truth of grace, focusing all of our energies on *works*. Works is how the world operates; we are judged by the number and quality of our good works. We may believe that our lives depend on God's grace, but we act like it depends on us and how well we can perform. We wake up each morning with a list a mile long hoping that God will keep up with our score for the day. We spend the day trying to earn His love when in fact we already have it.

Matthew 11: 29-30 says, "Come to me, all of you who are weary and burdened, and I will give you rest. Take my yoke upon you and learn from me, for I am gentle and humble in heart, and you will find rest for your souls. For my yoke is easy and my burden light." When your list gets too long and you are weighted down by tasks that are impossible for you to do alone, invite Jesus to share your burden. Don't stop doing good things for others, but remember we will never earn enough points to merit His love. It's all about the grace we receive because He loves us unconditionally.

Salkehatchie Summer Service in South Carolina is a pioneering servant ministry at selected sites in South Carolina involving high school and college age youth, adult community leaders and persons of different cultures in upgrading housing, motivating community cooperative efforts by helping persons to help themselves, and providing all participants with opportunities for personal growth and service. The program offers 50 different ministry sites this summer involving anywhere from 35 to 190 participants per site. Elliott Withers, Corey McVay and Sallyanne McVay will leave early on Saturday, July 11 for the Santee site (in Clarendon County near Summerton, SC). News from the Finance Committee

Asbury Memorial UMC received approximately \$13,000 less in money than budgeted from January through May 2015. We were able to contain operating expenses, which saved \$3,000. However, this still left us with a shortfall of over \$10,000 through May. No operating funds were used to fund the unanticipated \$30,000 education building roof replacement. We could use your help in meeting our operating budget for 2015, so please consider increasing your 2015 giving. Thank you for your faithful financial support.
