

# Message from the Capital Campaign Committee

"When life gives you lemons, make lemonade" is a proverbial phrase used to encourage optimism and a can-do attitude in the face of adversity.

On April 25<sup>th</sup>, our beloved friend, church member and Capital Campaign Committee advisor, Robert Wiltshire, joined the Church Triumphant. This tragic event was not listed in the nine-step "Campaign Work Plan Outline" that he presented to us at our first meeting in January. His leadership advanced us through step 5. At our last meeting in May, the committee reached step 8-"May 16-June 5...Follow-ups as needed to secure other pledges."

It is often challenging to move ahead when your guide departs. What our committee discovered was the strength Robert had left among us to continue his commitment ensuring the legacy of our church. That is what the campaign has been about from the beginning.

The Building Committee has been expanded by adding Don Jackson to work alongside Bud Allison and Brad Arnold. Other volunteers stepped forward to assist as well. They presented a proposed construction projects schedule to the Church Council on May 15. The Council adopted "in spirit" the schedule and gave the go ahead to the Building Committee.

**Phase I**: (to begin in 2016) -North side parking and landscaping improvements, south side parking improvements with an in-out drive from Kimberly Avenue to drop off at choir room door, landscaping improvements, new sidewalks, covered porch at choir room door entry level with handicapped access to the Sanctuary, and a Memorial Garden. (estimated cost of approximately \$200,000)

**Phase II**: (to begin as soon as Phase I is completed and funding allows); (estimated completion 2018) Replacement of Sanctuary roof, construction of new bathroom(s) on Sanctuary level, Fellowship Hall and kitchen renovations (estimated cost of \$100,000).

As of 5/22/16, 36 families + North Asheville Preschool have made gifts or pledges that total \$191,000. Already in the first two months of the campaign we have reached 62% of our goal-a fantastic achievement thanks to each of you who has made this possible through your generosity! The remaining families continue to consider their responses. Our committee is working on accomplishing step 8-contacting all remaining current and former members and their families.

Robert has gone ahead to "Prepare the Way" for the Saints of Asbury who will follow him one day. He entrusted the legacy of Asbury to those of us in the Church on earth. Walk in faith with us.

For the information of all members and anyone owning a conventional IRA, anyone over 70.5 is required to take a minimum required distribution (MRD) each year or pay a penalty of 50% of the distribution. All IRA owners required to take the MRD qualify for a Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD). All or any portion of your distribution donated to a qualifying charity is wholly tax free to you, which means you do not pay income tax on the QCD, which in turn lowers your adjusted gross income and your tax liability for the year. Also for tax filers that itemize deductions on Schedule A, you still claim the charitable deduction on your return. This is a perfect way for individuals to meet Campaign pledges and regular church pledges. I am here to help anytime on this or on stock donations to our campaign.
